

**Kasey Beville** is graduating December 2018 from James Madison University.



# FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

Each year, we ask the various groups within the church with a checking account to give us a statement showing income and expenditures, and we do this for two reasons. The Book of Discipline states that we are responsible for all funds collected and spent by Ramsey Church from any and all sources. But it is also a good way to publicize the generosity and hard work of these groups.

We received statements from 14 groups - Sunday School classes, UMW Circles, the Choir, the BUCS, the Youth, the 55+ luncheon group, and the Mission Team. For 2017, they reported total income of over \$30,000, of which about half came from member donations. The rest of it came from various fundraisers - selling pecans, Brunswick stew, donuts, a bake sale, craft sale, yard sale, Spud Sunday, Santa Breakfast, Valentines Dinner Dance, a dodgeball tournament, and the Mothers' Day/Fathers' Day bulletin inserts.

What did they do with all this money? Several thousand dollars were donated back to our church for the Lenten Offering, snacks for the Care-a-van staff, our Food Pantry, love baskets for our shut-ins, CARITAS, White Christmas, flowers and gifts for the sick, kitchen dues, thank-you gifts, a new freezer, the Spring Festival, meals for our church families after funerals, memorials, and love offerings.

A lot of money was donated to various groups in our community and our state – J.L. Francis Elementary School, the Good Samaritan Inn, the Hermitage Samaritan Fund, YMCA, a birthday party at the Hermitage, school kits for Conference, The Ellen Project, Youth missions, Impact Richmond, our Mission Team, and the VCU Scott Stevens Scholarship.

And there was still enough money left to spread all over our country and beyond through programs such as World Vision, UMCOR hurricane relief, and flood buckets sent by the United Methodist Church wherever they are needed.

What an impressive list!

Thanks to all these groups for their energy and dedication.

Your stewardship is an example to us all.
