11 Therefore, knowing the fear of the Lord, we try to persuade people, but we ourselves are well known to God, and I hope that we are also well known to your consciences. 12 We are not commending ourselves to you again but giving you an opportunity to boast about us, so that you may be able to answer those who boast in outward appearance and not in the heart. 13 For if we are beside ourselves, it is for God; if we are in our right mind, it is for you. 14 For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. 15 And he died for all, so that those who live might live no

longer for themselves but for the one who for their sake died and was raised.

No, we are giving you a reason to be proud of us, so you can answer those who brag about having a spectacular ministry rather than having a sincere heart. 13 If it seems we are crazy, it is to bring glory to God. And if we are in our right minds, it is for your benefit. 14 Either way, Christ's love controls us. Since we believe that Christ died for all, we also believe that we have all died to our old life. 15 He died for everyone so that those who receive his new life will no longer live for themselves. Instead, they will live for Christ, who died and was raised for them.

16 So we have stopped evaluating others from a human point of view. At one time we thought of Christ merely from a human point of view. How differently

we know him now! 17 This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!

TURNING OUR PRAYER LIST INTO A CARE LIST

Prayer is one of the most important things Christians can do for one another, especially during times of life's difficulties and struggles. We have the opportunity to consider doing more by turning our prayer list into a "Care List." Several members of Ramsey have looked into the possibility of beginning a Stephen Ministry which would give us the ability to reach out to individuals here at church and, potentially, in the community, who would appreciate having someone walk beside them during times of a life difficulty or crisis. Stephen Ministry is a proven and effective way to organize, equip, and support a team of congregation members (called Stephen Ministers) to provide high-quality, one-to-one, Christ-centered care to those experiencing life difficulties. Some of these include:

- Grieving the loss of a loved one
- Those experiencing a medical crisis or terminal illness
 - Divorce (before, during, or after)
 - Families with children who have disabilities

These are just a few of the many challenges or needs for care in any congregation. Stephen Ministers do not act as professional counselors, but as Christians willing to commit to those for a time who are in need of support. Stephen Ministers will receive their training and support by Stephen Leaders here at Ramsey. If you are interested in learning more about becoming a Stephen Minister and what is involved or just more about the ministry and what we hope to offer, a question and answer session will be held following the 10 am service on Sunday, January 29.
