# LETTERS FROM THE PASTORS

Dear Ramsey Saints,

In 1707 Isaac Watts composed the words to the hymn "Alas! and Did My Savior Bleed" or later referenced as "At the Cross". In 1885 Ralph Hudson took the verse lyrics and added a then familiar camp-meeting refrain of "at the cross" to the lyrics of Watt's hymn, giving us the version found in our United Methodist Hymnal #359. That refrain states, "At the cross, at the cross, where I first saw the light, and the burden of my heart rolled away; it was there by faith I received my sight, and now I am happy all the day."

These lyrics provide us a summary of the powerfulness of Christ's death on the cross as the agent of transformation in our lives. This year during Lent, in our sermon series we will be facing the cross. Remembering what Jesus's death in the 1st century A.D. on the cross means to our daily lives in the 21st century. The plan that God put into motion from the Garden of Eden's fall from grace came to fruition in the death of Jesus on our behalf on the cross. Jesus, the perfect sacrifice for our human sinfulness, opened the door to our being able to be back in right relationship with God – not in our righteousness but in Christ's redemptive work for us. The redemption is done, we have only to accept the offer of grace and receive the gift of salvation from our fallen, sinful ways.

As we embark on our Lenten Journey 2023, we do so with a reminder of what it cost Jesus for us to by "faith receive our sight and now be happy all the day." We have been redeemed by grace, forgiven and set free to love and serve God and others. So, Ramsey Church Saints, let's spend these 40 days of Lent doing just that – loving God, facing the cross and its gift to us, and sharing that love and grace with the world.

And it is that the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is there is freedom. 2 Corinthians 3.17.


It is amazing and wonderful to hear what is happening at Asbury University, KY. On Wednesday, February 8, an ordinary day in the lives of many students, once again the university was rocked by the vibrant presence of the Spirit of God. According to reports, the university had already witnessed how the Spirit of God moves touching lives and calling them to repentance, calling them to an intimate and personal relationship with their God. How good it feels to return from vacation and hear this kind of news, news from the kingdom of God, which announces what happens when there are open ears and hearts willing to move to the rhythm of the Spirit of God. What a greater truth, that where the Spirit of the Lord is there is freedom.

"No one wants to leave" is the testimony of one of the young students at Asbury University. I share with you some of the reasons why I believe nobody wants to leave. Paul in Corinthians says, "where the Spirit of God is there is liberty." Hebrews 4:12 says that "The word of God is quick and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword; and it penetrates to split the soul and the spirit, the joints and the marrow, and discerns the thoughts and intentions of the heart". In Spanish we have a song that goes like this, "when the Lord's people praise God, things happen, wonderful things happen. There is healing, deliverance, the presence of the Lord is felt." I remind you also of one of John Wesley's famous lines, "Light yourself on fire with passion and people will come from miles to watch you burn."

Why Wilmore, KY? What is so special about Asbury University? Why not every state in the nation? I don't know, but one thing I do know, that God is being glorified by a generation of young people under 25 years of age who seek an encounter with his God. And what do we have to do? Why not do what Jesus told John's disciples when he asked the question, if he was the one to come, or if they should wait for another. Jesus' response was: "Go and tell John what you are seeing and hearing. Tell him that the blind see, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed of their disease, the deaf hear, the dead come back to life, and the good news is announced to the poor. And blessed is he who finds no cause for stumbling in me!" (Matthew 11:3-6). God is being exalted and glorified and the divine business of saving souls for Christ is burning up a few miles from Richmond, VA. Bless the Lord my soul!


